# Internal Affairs Overview

The BART Police Office of Internal Affairs received 97 complaints from citizens with regards to police conduct during 2022.

- Of the 97 complaints, 86 were reported and investigated as Formal Citizen Complaints.
- An additional 6 complaints were reported as Informal Citizen Complaints and were addressed through Supervisory Referrals.

There were 5 Administrative Investigations initiated by the Office of Internal Affairs.





\* Service Review: When a citizen/employee raises a concern pertaining to the global practice throughout the Department such as Department policy, procedure and/or tactics.







### Citizen Demographics for Formal and Informal Complaints:




# Demographics of BART Ridership:

### Use of Force



There was a total of 324 reportable use of force incidents (as defined in Policy 300) in 2022 and **82,337** total calls for service/incidents, meaning that officers used force in fewer than .394% of all calls for service/incidents during the year. The sum of the graph totals more than 324 incidents because some incidents may involve more than one type of force.
