### 2. Public Comments

Shawn Costello mentioned he has a couple of concerns. He mentioned at 12<sup>th</sup> St. BART station, at the upper-level elevator alcove, the light has been out for a while. He mentioned the San Leandro elevator is too small. He added that the elevator doors to the San Francisco platform does not open all the way.

Aleta Dupree introduced herself and said she often felt alone when it comes to sharing matters of disability to the BART Board of Directors. She mentioned it is hard for her because she does not appear to look disabled. She asked people to expand their consciousness to think of disability community as being very diverse. She asked that people join in her journey and that people with disabilities can be fully accepted within the BART system.

Lucky Maxwell introduced themselves and their pronouns are they and them. They mentioned they work at Center of Independent, Berkeley, as the Transportation Coordinator. They wanted to know if the trains could be marked with a symbol on the outside of the train to indicate where a person who uses a mobility device may board. They suggested having BATF meetings recorded, so that they are available for those who were not able to attend the meetings in person.

### 3. Approval of June 27, 2024 meeting minutes

Herb Hastings moved approval of the June 27, 2024, meeting minutes with some amendments. Clarence R. Fischer second the motion.

Motion passes with eleven (11) in favor, zero (0) against, and one (1) abstention

### 4. Accessibility improvement program phases 1 & 2 project update

Ahmad Rassai (AR) presented on, "Accessibility improvement program phases 1 & 2: project update."

AR went over project overview and the budget.

He shared what has been completed at Fremont, Bay Fair, Hayward, Castro Valley, Fruitvale, San Leandro, MacArthur, Rockridge, Lafayette, North Berkeley, and Richmond. AR went over some of the completed projects:

- replacement of curb ramps
- replacement of handrails
- replacement of courtesy phones
- Installation of new elevator lobby lights
- Removal of platform and/or concourse phone cubes

AR mentioned some stations listed still need work on better accessible pathways, removal of payphones, updated handrails at stairwells, replacement of courtesy phones, and better lighting at some stations.

He mentioned the next twelve (12) stations going through its design work to better improve Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), accessible pathways are El Cerrito del Norte, El Cerrito Plaza, Downtown Berkeley, Ashby, Embarcadero, Montgomery, Powell, Civic Center/UN Plaza, 16<sup>th</sup> St, 24<sup>th</sup> St, Glen Park, and Balboa Park BART Stations and will give an update at an upcoming meeting.

Clarence R. Fischer expressed concerns that there are not enough seating within the BART system. He would like to see more seats available at the loading area and bus station locations. Annie Koruga agreed with Clarence's comment.

Danny Kodmur would like to see smaller elevators replaced with larger elevators to fit larger wheelchairs. He also asked if some of the railings can be taken out in the smaller, older elevators or will this be violating ADA law?

Danny Kodmur and Bruce Yow wanted to see the contract specifications for more details on the project to ensure accessibility issues are addressed.

Anita Ortega asked if the new call boxes that replaced courtesy phones could be easy to locate and asked if all payphones will be taken out of BART stations. AR shared the new call boxes are larger than the courtesy phones and there are signs indicating call boxes, more visible. He mentioned payphones belong to independent vendors and is not aware if all payphones will be taken out. Director Robert Raburn mentioned that he would like to see vandalized payphones removed from the system.

Aleta Dupree mentioned fixing the sidewalks are essential and that we can always improve BART's system.

Bruce Yow asked if BATF members have some comprehensive ADA review process of designs. Bob Franklin stated BATF members is to provide input to making the BART system accessible.

Roland Wong thanked AR for his presentation.

### 5. New committee member nomination, Sam Buman

Roland Wong led agenda item, "New committee member nomination, Sam Buman."

Sam Buman introduced himself and expressed why he is interested in joining the BATF.

Herb Hastings moved to recommend Sam Buman as a BATF member. Clarence R. Fischer seconded the motion.

Motion passes with eleven (11) in favor, zero (0) against, and one (1) abstention

### 6. Review final approved BART Accessibility Task Force (BATF) By-Laws

Elena Van Loo led agenda item, "Review final approved BART Accessibility Task Force (BATF) By-Laws."

She announced BATF members approved parts of the BATF By-Laws on June 27, 2024 and BART Board of Directors passed to update the BATF By-Laws on July 11, 2024.

Elena Van Loo went over what was passed:

### ARTICLE III – RESPONSIBILITIES (page 2)

B. In order accomplish these responsibilities BATF shall:
#6 - Complete ethics training required by the State of California within six months of being appointed to the BATF and every two years for active BATF members. (clarification to completing ethics training to new appointed members and active members)

ARTICLE IV – MEMBERSHIP (page 3) C. NOMINATION AND SECLECTION PROCESS ... Out of three consecutive meetings, an interested applicant must attend two and then apply for membership... (shorten the time to recruit BATF members)

### ARTICLE VI – OFFICERS (page 5)

### D. ELECTION OF CHAIR, VICE-CHAIR AND 2<sup>ND</sup> VICE-CHAIR

#1 – Term of Office

The officers of the BATF shall serve for one year or until the next election is held. Officers shall serve for no more than two consecutive terms in the same office, unless no other member is interested in serving in that role. After a one-year break, members may serve in any officer role again. (give more members a chance to serve as committee leaders)
