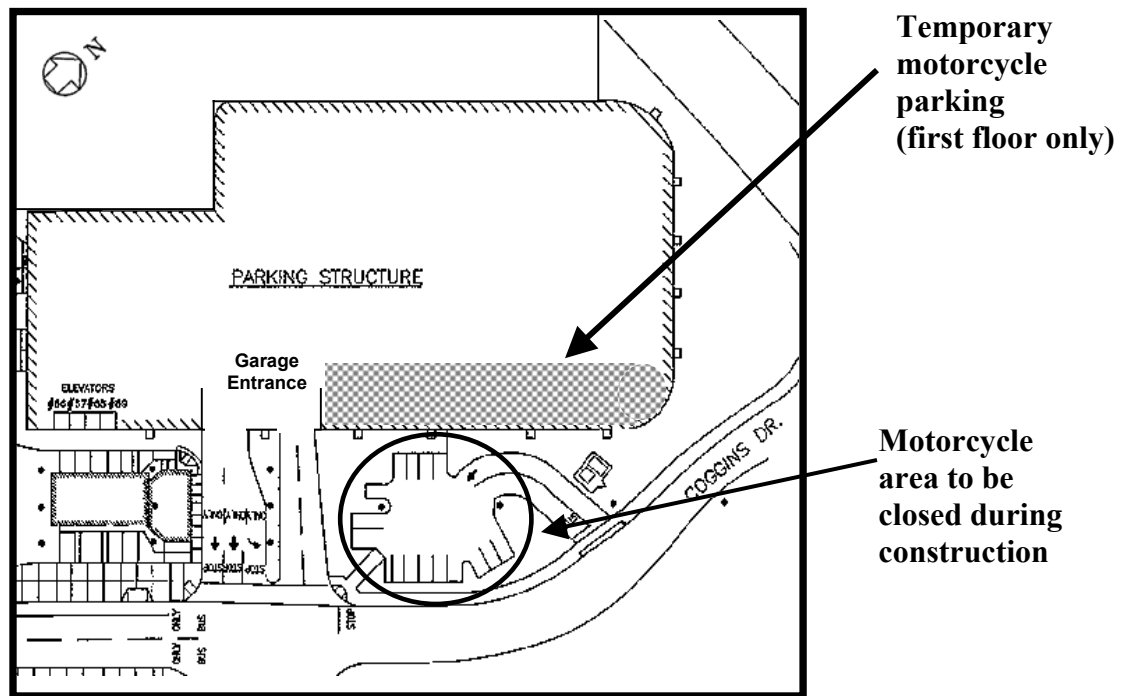

Temporary Changes to Parking At Pleasant Hill Station

December 2008

Dear BART Patron:

As part of our system-wide Earthquake Safety Program, we will begin strengthening the parking structure at Pleasant Hill Station to withstand future earthquakes. The work will require temporary closure of the motorcycle parking area northeast of the station along Coggins Drive. This area is expected to be closed for 7 months. **Motorcycle parking will be relocated to the first level of the parking garage. A limited number of car vehicle parking spaces will be converted to motorcycle stalls to accommodate the relocation. In addition, the total number of daily parking spaces will be reduced by 30 stalls in order to make way for construction work.** During the project, you can expect construction-related noise, dust and inconvenience. Please watch for signs with safety information and other notices. We appreciate your patience and cooperation during this work.



Related projects to strengthen columns and fixtures at the Pleasant Hill station and the adjacent BART aerial structures will occur in the future. Earthquake Safety Program construction will be

underway at various locations throughout the BART system over the next five years, and is expected to be complete by the end of 2013. As always, safety is BART's top priority. Our aim is to strengthen BART as quickly as possible, while maintaining BART service.
